Installation of New Officers & Directors

Mark is a principal with the engineering firm of Aillet, Fenner, Jolly & McClelland and serves as the Board Chairman and Civil Engineering Department Head. He began his career with the firm in 1986 and has been involved with a wide variety of projects for Federal, State, local governments, architects, private and industrial clients.

Mark is active with the United Way of Northwest

Louisiana (Board of Directors 2018 to present) and Shreveport Chamber of Commerce (Board of Directors 2020 to Present, VP of Education 2022). Prior services were with Louisiana Economic Development CEO Roundtable NWLA, Downtown Shreveport Unlimited, Shreveport-Bossier YMCA Corporate Board and many others.

He also is currently on the Shreveport-Bossier Mayors' Prayer Breakfast Committee, Bible Study Fellowship Men's Group Leader, Divorce Care Leader/Facilitator at Broadmoor Baptist Church. He has held numerous leadership positions with professional organizations such as the American Society of Civil Engineers, Louisiana Engineering Society and the American Council of Engineering Companies.

Mark received his B.S. in civil engineering from LA Tech, his M.S. in engineering and technology management from LA Tech and has earned 36 hours toward his M.S.C.E. from LA Tech. He has received numerous professional awards over the years: LES Andrew Lockett Award for Civil Activities 2008, ASCE Louisiana Section Outstanding Civil Engineer 2007 just to name a few.

He joined our club in 2005 and became very involved in many projects (such as our fund-raising DragonBoat Festival). He was awarded the Rotarian of the Year Award for 2014-2015 and is a Paul Harris Fellow +6.

His business was started in Shreveport in 2012 and within the first three years attained top tier status in the national franchise.

Robert is a Certified Senior Advisor and a licensed insurance producer specializing in long term care policies. He was born and reared in rural Winn Parish on a cattle and hay farm. His early career aspirations took him to New York City where he was worked at the world headquarters of Revlon, Inc. and where he discovered his love of marketing. He started his own direct marketing business in the 1990s which marketed and sold Halloween costumes directly to consumers via the internet. Soon afterward, he and his partner founded founded Preferred Care at Home.



Robert serves as the President of the Board of Directors for The Bridge Alzheimer's and Dementia Resource Center. He joined our

club in 2017 and was Rotarian of the Year the very next year as he was recognized for his Polio fund-raising efforts. He was a Club Director in 2020-2021.



Joe Littlejohn received his PHF+8 lapel pin with 3 rubies from President-Elect Mark Snow. Joe has been a registered representative for New York Life for 40 years. He holds the CLU designation which is the premier designation for life insurance professionals. A graduate of Jesuit Shreveport he received his bachelor's degree from LSUS and his MBA from Centenary. She became a U.S. citizen at age 12.

Paulette relocated to Shreveport from Arkansas a few years ago. While in Little Rock, she was the former Executive Director of Arkansas Blood Institute, where she managed the daily operations of the non-profit blood bank for Central Arkansas. Prior to this leadership position, she was the Director of Business Development for The Poultry Federation in Little Rock. She served as an honorary commander of the Little Rock Air Force Base. The 2018 *Arkansas Business Journal 250* publication named her as one of the state's top influential business leaders. She is a graduate of the University of the Ozarks-Clarksville with a bachelor's degree in business administration. 
